

FREE TAFE COURSES

Whether you're looking to commence your career, reskill or upskill, we offer a wide range of Free TAFE courses*, providing you study opportunities to fill identified in-demand industry jobs.

Free TAFE can help cover the cost of tuition for selected courses. See if you meet the eligibility criteria below.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Residential status: Any Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident or New Zealand citizen is eligible for a Free TAFE course in Victoria.

Previous qualification: You can do your first Free TAFE course no matter what qualifications you already hold. This applies to all qualifications - whether they be through TAFE or university. This is because the 'upskilling rule' has been removed.

Multiple Free TAFE courses: You can do multiple Free TAFE courses in the same occupational pathway listed under 'Free TAFE Priority Pathways' below.

This is because the 'once-in-a-lifetime limit' requirement for Free TAFE has now been removed for Priority Pathways.

Note: Students who choose a Free TAFE course that is not part of a Priority Pathway can only study one Free TAFE course.

Students whose only Free TAFE fee waiver was under JobTrainer can also do another Free TAFE course, either in a pathway or non-pathway program.

Free TAFE priority pathways do not include apprenticeship pathway courses.

You will be charged for any additional non-tuition fees relating to your studies, which may include material and consumable fees.

Note: Some Priority Pathway courses are not offered at Bendigo TAFE. See the full list of Priority Pathway courses at vic.gov.au/free-tafe. You can continue to study your Priority Pathway at Bendigo TAFE even if you have started the Pathway at another TAFE.

WHERE DO I START?

PREREQUISITES

You may need to meet some entry requirements in order to enrol in one of our programs. These requirements vary for each course, but may include:

- A minimum age (some courses require that you are over 18 so that you can legally work in the industry)
- Satisfactory language, literacy and numeracy skills
- A Police Check or a Working with Children Check (if you are working in an industry that has contact with children or the public)
- Evidence of immunisations. Some courses such as health care may require additional immunisations.

These prerequisites are not designed to be a blocker to entry in the course, but to ensure that you are compliant and ready to be employed in the industry once you complete your training with us.

RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING (RPL) AND SKILLS RECOGNITION

If you have acquired relevant skills and knowledge in your workplace, through previous training, or even via volunteer work, you may not need to complete further study to obtain a qualification.

STUDENT GRADUATION

The Graduation Ceremony is a yearly event that celebrates the achievements of students who have completed their studies with Bendigo TAFE.

Eligible students will receive their invitations via email between December-February once they have completed their course of study. This occurs when the teaching department authorises the completion and students have received their certificate via a secure digital platform - My eEquals.

Please note: Certificates of qualifications are not received at the Graduation Ceremony. Students will be able to access their qualifications within real time once issued via My eEquals.



STUDENT AWARDS

Each year a number of students are selected by their teaching area to receive awards and be interviewed for the overall Student of the Year and Apprentice of the Year.

Award recipients and their guests are invited to attend Bendigo TAFE's annual Industry Excellence Awards night, a networking event where all winners are presented with their prizes onstage.



INDIGENOUS EDUCATION CENTRE

The Indigenous Education Centre (IEC) at Bendigo TAFE is an innovative environment that fosters and promotes Indigenous learning, while supporting Indigenous students undertaking study and training in a wide array of courses across the institute.

Honouring the traditional landowners of the area, across Bendigo and Echuca which include the Djaara people of the Dja Dja Wurrung and Yorta Yorta Nation. The centre merges the cultural heritage and values of these landowners with contemporary Aboriginal culture and strong networks with key Aboriginal organisations to ensure that our students are supported through their time with us.

As one of the state's largest providers of training and education, Bendigo TAFE delivers a wide range of courses and programs. Our courses are designed in consultation with communities and employers which means that Aboriginal students gain skills and knowledge while improving their networks and employment options.

The IEC plays an important role in supporting Aboriginal students at Bendigo TAFE, providing them with a welcoming environment at all times and assisting them where required to find the course of their choice, getting enrolled and starting their training.

OUR STUDENTS

The IEC welcomes all Indigenous Australians. Our students come from many different backgrounds ranging from early school leavers to people over 50.

We support students engaged in a variety of courses across the institute, from foundation to entry level courses which include language, literacy, numeracy and computer skills, cultural education and advanced courses from the certificate I level all the way to diplomas and advanced diplomas.

Students learn through a combination of classroom, practical, flexible and online learning techniques.

A majority of the students engage in the course of their choice at the TAFE and use the IEC for cultural activities or for support (if required). We also conduct a number of events through the year, celebrating Aboriginal culture and key milestones to which all the students are invited to along with their friends and family.

Most importantly, we have a dedicated Koorie Student Support Officer, Koorie Liaison Officer as well as a Koorie Engagement Mentor based at the IEC to assist students in accessing the full range of support services through the institute, as well as assisting them navigate their way in dealing with government agencies and other relevant organisations.

OUR PARTNERSHIPS

The IEC has forged strong relationships with key Aboriginal organisations across Victoria. We work closely with these organisations to ensure that our students have access to all the resources they require throughout their time with us. We also encourage our students to form and establish their own relationships with these organisations and support facilities in order to continue working with them as they move from their TAFE course into a career.

INDIGENOUS CULTURAL AWARENESS TRAINING (ICAT)

We are committed to supporting organisations in gaining a greater understanding of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander History and Culture. This program enables workforces to build successful working relationships with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities.

The ICAT program is designed to provide participants with a practical understanding required for successfully working with the Victorian Indigenous Community. It also builds awareness of Indigenous issues and aims to eradicate apprehension or misconception about Indigenous people.

The program is tailored to not only provide a historical perspective but to also provide learning which can be applied in every day situations. We focus on developing improvement of strategies targeted at Indigenous recruitment and employment. We also offer follow-up support and ongoing consultation.

RECONNECT

Reconnect is a free service that can provide personalised support and course related financial assistance to disengaged, high needs learners. This service works with your strengths and your individual learning goals to help you successfully return to education, training and/or employment.

To be eligible for the Reconnect program you must be:

A Young Person

Aged 17-19: Not engaged in education or training for six months or more (less than 8 hours per week).

A Mature Participant

Aged 20-64: Unemployed for six months or more (less than 8 hours per week) and not engaged in education or training for six months or more (less than 8 hours a week).

A Young Person Impacted by the Justice System

Young people aged 17-24 who have been or are currently on Youth Justice Orders.

An Asylum Seeker

A 17-64 year old without citizenship but holds a valid Bridging Visa Class E (BVE), Safe Haven Enterprise Visa (SHEV), Temporary Protection Visa (TPV), Temporary Humanitarian Stay (Subclass 449) or Temporary Humanitarian Concern (Subclass 786) Visa.

Out of Home Care

Aged 17-64: A person that has a current or previous experience with Child Protection.

ELIGIBILITY

How much you pay is determined by the course you enrol in, the scheduled hours you commit to undertake, your eligibility for a government subsidised place and any concession entitlements you might be eligible for.

GOVERNMENT SUBSIDIES

You may be eligible for government subsidised training if you are:

- An Australian citizen
- An Australian permanent resident (holder of a permanent visa)
- A New Zealand citizen

And are any of the following:

- Under 20 years of age
- Seeking to enrol in a Foundation Program course (and do not hold a Diploma or above qualification or are receiving core skills training in other sectors)
- Seeking to enrol in VCE VM or VPC
- Seeking to enrol in an apprenticeship
- 20 years and older and 'upskilling' by seeking to enrol in a course at a higher level **than your existing qualification**
- Seeking to enrol in a Skill Set

There are further restrictions on the number of qualifications and skills sets you can undertake in a year, at a time or at a level, as well as a limit to one Free TAFE course per eligible student unless the Free TAFE courses you choose are part of the Free TAFE Priority Pathways initiative.



CONCESSION

You may be entitled to a concession on your tuition fees if you are in a government subsidised place and you meet the below criteria:

- Are enrolled in a certificate I to certificate IV course
- Hold a current and valid:
 - Health Care Card;
 - Pensioner Card; or
 - Veteran's Gold Card

A dependant spouse or child of a card holder is also entitled to the Fee Concession.

If your tuition fee concession application is successful, your concession fee will be charged at 20% of the government subsidised tuition rate for your program.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students in a government subsidised place will continue to be eligible to access concession at all program levels (including diploma, advanced diploma, vocational graduate certificate and vocational graduate diploma programs).

FULL FEE

If you are not eligible for government subsidised training you will pay the full fee listed on the respective course page.

ADDITIONAL FEES

In addition to the tuition fee you may be required to pay any applicable materials and consumables fees.

PATHWAYS TO UNIVERSITY

Getting started on your journey after finishing school can be tough. With so many choices, expenses and paths to follow it can be a challenge to work out what's right for you.

TAFE is the perfect transition between school and university. Our learning environment is different to a school environment, you have the opportunity to work directly with clients and take a more work-focused approach rather than just as a student.

Your ATAR score is no barrier to further study, you can gain a Bendigo TAFE qualification and still go to university too.

Starting your pathway at TAFE can reduce the time it would normally take to complete a degree at university. Many TAFE qualifications, such as advanced diploma, diploma and some certificate IV qualifications, provide credits towards a university undergraduate course. This means that you can gain credits towards completion of your chosen undergraduate course without studying similar units.

PAYMENT OPTIONS

FLEXIBLE PAYMENT PLAN

Payment plans are available to anyone enrolling into a certificate I, II, III and IV course. Bendigo TAFE offers eligible students the option of paying their course fees over time by setting up either weekly or fortnightly instalment payments to cover their tuition, materials and consumables.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND GRANTS

At Bendigo TAFE, we believe in rewarding hard work and achievement. We offer a number of scholarships and grants to help pay for your course.

VET STUDENT LOANS

A student loan scheme is available for eligible students and courses to assist in the payment of tuition fees whilst studying at TAFE. These are called VET Student Loans and replaced the VET FEE-HELP scheme from 1 January 2017.

Loans are capped according to the course you are studying. These loans are income contingent and interest free and are repaid via the Australian Taxation Office when your income reaches a certain threshold. For 2022-2023 income year, the threshold is \$48,361. The loan will continue to be a debt to the government until it is repaid.

You will still have to pay the materials and consumables fee (if studying a government subsidised course) and other non-tuition fees (if applicable) at the time of enrolment. To be eligible for a VET Student Loan, you must be an Australian citizen; holder of a permanent humanitarian visa who will be residing in Australia for the duration of study; or a qualifying New Zealand citizen.

VET Student Loans will not be granted to students who do not meet the above criteria.

APPRENTICESHIPS INCENTIVES PROGRAM

The Australian government has established the Australian Apprenticeships Incentives Program to encourage genuine opportunities for people to enter into skills based training through Australian Apprenticeships.

Apprentices may be eligible for a range of payments to assist them with the initial set up costs and completion of their apprenticeship.

APPRENTICESHIPS & TRAINEESHIPS

Apprenticeships and traineeships are customised training programs that are developed to meet evolving industry needs.

They are a great way to kick-start your career in a variety of industries and roles by combining your training and paid employment.

WHAT ARE APPRENTICESHIPS AND TRAINEESHIPS?

Apprenticeships and traineeships are a great option for anyone looking to get a job or take their career in a different direction. As a Bendigo TAFE apprentice or trainee, you will receive a personalised training plan. We will provide you with the skills and technical knowledge specific to your workplace, trade or vocation. All our apprenticeship and traineeship programs incorporate learning that takes place in the workplace. As a Bendigo TAFE apprentice or trainee we can help you to kick-start your career with both on and off-the-job training. It's this blended approach to your learning that will help you to graduate with confidence, experience and be ready for the workforce with real skills.

IS AN APPRENTICESHIP OR TRAINEESHIP RIGHT FOR ME?

If you are interested in working in a skilled trade such as building, hairdressing, automotive or electrical then an apprenticeship is for you. If you are interested in working in a vocational role such as office administration or information technology then a traineeship will get you started.

APPRENTICESHIP SUPPORT PROGRAM



WHAT ARE VET PROGRAMS?

Vocational Education and Training (VET) studies combine general Victorian Certificate of Education Vocational Major (VCE VM) or Victorian Pathways Certificate (VPC) with vocational training and experience in the workplace.

A VET program offers students the opportunity to complete a nationally recognised qualification while providing credit towards the VCE VM or VPC, just like other subject areas. The vocational qualification provides access to further training and could improve your chances of finding a job when you finish school.

HOW DOES VET CONTRIBUTE TOWARDS VCE?

All VCE VET programs and most VET programs are fully recognised within the Unit 1-4 structure of the VCE and contribute towards the satisfactory completion of your VCE. Most VET programs require two years to complete.

A number of VCE VET programs also have a study score attached which contributes towards your ATAR score. Students who study VCE VET programs and receive a Unit 3-4 sequence will be eligible for a 10 percent increment towards their ATAR (10 percent of the average of the primary four scaled studies) or a direct contribution through an external exam, just like other VCE subjects.

HOW DOES VET CONTRIBUTE TOWARDS VCE VM OR VPC?

Within the VCE VM or VPC certificates, VET programs satisfy the Industry Specific Skills Strand requirements. If a student completes a full VET program (Units 1-4) they should achieve 4 units of credit towards their VCE VM or VPC certificates.
